We are aware that the Inspectors undertook an unaccompanied site visit 26 to 28 April 2021, and that on 5 May the Examining Authority agreed to delay the start of the Examination for up to 4 months.

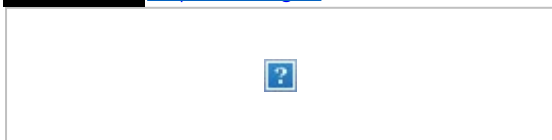
The Examining Authority's Assessment of Principal Issues dated 12 May 2021 identifies Biodiversity and Ecology as a principal issue and sets out 24 questions for examination. Given the recognised importance of the site for biodiversity and ecology we write to encourage the Inspectors to take advantage of the Examination's delay and seasonal changes to undertake a further unaccompanied site visit.
