The acceptance process was discussed without prejudice to the IPC's position on receipt of the application documents.
The ExA may (within the Infrastructure Planning (Examination Procedures) Rules 2010 rule 8 letter) request statements of common ground and specify the issues they want dealt with.
If the application is accepted, the IPC is likely to undertake a series of outreach events in the vicinity of the proposal sites to inform members of the public about the registration process. The local authorities stressed the importance of tailoring these events appropriately to ensure the public have ample opportunity to learn about the process. The IPC will work closely with the local authorities in organising the outreach.
