Dear Sir Madam,

I am writing on behalf of, and as chair of the Destination Anglesey Partnership (DAP). The purpose and remit of the DAP is to ensure private sector interests are represented in all tourism matters and have been working with both The IACC and Horizon on the Wylfa DCO submission for a number of years.

The DCO as submitted clearly impacts on the DAP and its members in respect of the tourism matters and issues as outlined in the Statement of Common Ground.

The DAP has, for some time, been working on developing and agreeing this Statement of Common Ground with Horizon Nuclear Power and this work continues with Horizon's encouragement.

The DAP did not, however, register as an Interested Party because it was assumed that the interaction with Horizon on the Statement of Common Ground was automatically taken forward as a matter for consideration by the Examination, and was not made aware otherwise.

Horizon, the Welsh Government and The IACC, as host local authority, are aware of the situation and would be supportive of registration of the DAP as an Interested Party. The IACC would be happy to confirm this separately, in writing, should that be of assistance.

I hope this our attendance can be considered and that you make an exception due to the high level of engagement the DAP has undertaken with the SoCG so far.
