I should like to address the inspectors at the above Hotel during the open floor hearings starting at 6.30 pm. on the 5.3.19, also at some point during the day on the 8.3.19 during the biodiversity topic hearings. Could I therefore reserve a place at the event on both dates.

I would also be grateful if you could inform me of the date by which, written statements must be made to the inspectorate for inclusion in the in the final assessment/adjudication.

The planning application for commencement of works at the power station specifically includes the construction of cooling ponds for containment of highly radioactive waste for an intermediate period prior to its removal to long term geological containment. As no such facility exists at present or future de facto site has been found, even though searched for by government agency, does it not make the inclusion of the cooling ponds illegitimate within the DCO as they are based on a hypothetical future facility only; albeit absolutely essential to the construction of the power plant. Does this thus make the whole project, including the DCO become redundant until the waste disposal facility situation is resolved?

This is not an argument for or against nuclear power, only the legal validity of the planning application. If you could request an interpretation of this aspect of the planning acts and process from your senior colleagues I would be most grateful. Perhaps it is a point to clarify under judicial review?
