Dear ExA

I note the response of the developer in document EN01007-003336-03 to my submissions at deadline 7, although they have said nothing new, or indeed addressed the points I made. They have also entirely omitted any response to my oral presentation which this document purports to be.

The key point of my additional submission, after the oral presentation, was that The Statement of Common Ground between Horizon and National Grid should not contain any reference to overhead transmission lines. I would have thought the reasoning was obvious - as there is currently no proposal for a grid connection, it is not factually correct to suggest that there is, and any technology type is irrelevant.

I would appreciate it if the ExA could encourage the developer to stick to facts and not include works of fiction in any documentation that may form part of the development consent order. The Statement of Common Ground requires revision, and I specifically request that the ExA ensures that this is done. I note that over 100 others expressed similar concerns.

The developer mentions precedent in granting consent to generators without the accompanying connection citing Hinckley C amongst others. I was under the impression that each application is viewed individually, and so precedent is irrelevant.
