I have the following concerns about the Agenda as set for the Preliminary Meeting.

I wish the Examining Authority to take into account the matters as set out below at the Preliminary Meeting:

Agenda Item 2: I would consider that the Applicant's proposed changes to the DCO application alter some of the Principal Issues as referred to in Agenda Item 4. As a result Agenda Item 5 should be considered before Agenda Item 4.

I do not understand why the proposed changes to the DCO application were made at such a late stage. It indicates that EDG had not been taking heed of the comments made by the participants in their responses to the various Stage Consultations.

Agenda Item 4: Matters of serious concern which should be considered as Principal issues are the question of coastal erosion, and specifically climate change/warming. The development will result in huge volumes of carbon emissions which have been under estimated by the Applicant.

I would ask the Examining Authority to specifically address the cumulative impact of the various proposed developments on traffic volumes. At present these comprise the Scottish Power Renewables, Sizewell C and the numerous housing developments. The increased traffic will have an impact on the environment and create noise and air pollution.

Agenda Item 5: I do not think that it is possible to properly evaluate the Principal Issues until the outcome of the Planning Inspectorate's consideration of the changes proposed by the Applicant after submission of the DCO are known.

Agenda Item 6: It is noted that due to the Council elections taking place in May the County Council will be in 'purdah', and so will not be permitted to participate in this process until after the election. In view of the fact that we are due to come out of lockdown in June I would ask that the timetable be delayed for a period of at least six weeks.
