Good afternoon, I have uploaded a Rule 6 response onto your web site today and it has not loaded correctly. There also doesn't seem to be any mechanism for saving my response electronically - I've tried to save, but the record is incomplete. I cannot circulate my members with my response.

1. My answer to question 13, the points I wish to make in response to Agenda Item 4 should be:

The Suffolk coast is a fragile and vulnerable asset which has suffered significant erosion and depletion for centuries. Nor can the coastline be regarded as a series of independent, discreet sections. This does not seem to be recognised by the Rule 6 letter and there appears to be no provision to discuss the adverse impact of the development upon coastal processes. It may be intended that the list of Principle Issues covers this under Resilience; we request that this be clarified by adding the effect on coastal processes and the neighbouring coastline of the development.

We wish to discuss:

- * The inadequate provision of information regarding the design of the HCDF/SCDF and the Beach Landing Facilities and the potential impact of those features upon coastal processes
- * The definition of the zone of influence of SZC upon coastal processes and the narrowness of the geographical area for monitoring
- * The proposal to cease monitoring at the time the plant ceases to be operational when it will continue to inhibit coastal processes long after that time
- * The lack of information or evidence provided in the application in respect of coastal processes in the Greater Sizewell Bay area and beyond.
