Re: Examining Panel question

- >> When I raised the question of outside site visits, the reply was Eastbridge area hadn't been visited. I feel it is particularly important this area has an unaccompanied visit, seeing the impact Sizewell C construction will have on this quiet country village for the reasons set out below:
- >> 1 Eastbridge is an isolated hamlet, in an AONB, a quiet, beautiful area east of the B1122 and the village of Theberton and within walking distance of the Sea and Minsmere RSPB Nature Reserve.
- >> 2. Resident's of Eastbridge are mainly retired elderly people. Driving to Leiston, on reaching the roundabout at the B1122 they will have to give way to heavy construction traffic coming from their right, which will make travelling to Leiston for some, an extremely daunting task.
- >> 3. The effect workers accommodation will have on this quiet country lane, both in construction and occupation and worker's movement
- >> 4. The effect burrow pits will have. It is difficult to visualise and difficult to understand why this is allowed to happen in an AONB
- >> 5. What effect Sizewell C's 24 hours construction will have on this quiet village; night-time noise, light and air pollution.
- >> 6. Because of it's beautiful and quiet locality the village has a number of holiday and 'second homes, there is also the popular Eel's Foot pub, all of which are reliant on tourism, which will almost be heavily reduced or almost non existent.
- >> 7. Any accident or congestion on the B1122 and proposed Theberton Bye-Pass will cause drivers, particularly site workers, to look for alternative routes. This is likely to result in a 'Rat run' through Minsmere Nature Reserve and Eastbridge.
- >> In view of the above points, I feel it is very difficult to understand the effects this construction will have on Eastbridge without a site visit.
