Community Safety Partnership / Safer Stronger Communities Board Action Plans

The Councils have prepared two action plans to avoid and mitigate community safety impacts. The two plans complement each other and will be implemented in close coordination between the Councils, and the respective East Suffolk Community Safety Partnership and the Safer Stronger Communities Board. Funding for the implementation of the East Suffolk Community Safety Partnership Action Plan would be through East Suffolk Council, whereas funding for the second action plan would be through Suffolk County Council's Community Safety Team.

Suffolk County Council Community Safety Action Plan to mitigate the likely impacts and risk of Sizewell C construction

The Action Plan below details the work areas that Suffolk County Council (SCC) Community Safety Team anticipate will be most impacted by the construction of Sizewell C. The action plan supports the LIR contribution made by SCC Community Safety which details the predicted risks and impact of Sizewell C in relation to these work areas.

SCC Community Safety work in partnership with other local authorities, Police, Fire and Rescue Service, Trading Standards, Clinical Commissioning Groups, the voluntary sector, Probation, and others to reduce crime and disorder in communities. The action plan however, refers solely to the work areas that SCC Community Safety lead on or coordinate.

Within the plan, the likely risk has been assessed in relation to the substantial demographic changes from the Sizewell C non-homebased construction workforce and reviewed to address how these risks could be mitigated by uplifting the current work programme.

An uplift in these work areas is required to effectively and positively mitigate the likely impacts in response to the change in demographics.
