Dear Michelle Gregory and PINS team,

I have been trying to get to grips with PINS references to the two main Scoping Report Opinions from 2014 and 2019.

As you will be aware the 2014 document is an overarching opinion for the entire project and the 2019 document reflects additional opinion on proposed changes to the project including amongst other things the Sizewell Link Road.

There are only two PINS references used throughout all the Navigation documents to EDF's Scoping Report (APP-168) and Scoping Report Opinion (APP-169).

All the Scoping Report Opinion links take you to the July 2019 document. The Scoping Report links to the associated May 2019 document.

The Scoping Report has the 2014 Report and Opinion documents as Appendices, but you cannot find the 2014 documents as individual documents within any Navigation document or an individual PINS reference to these two documents.

However, the 2014 Scoping Report Opinion is available as an individual document on the PINS website at 2014 Scoping Opinion and the report at 2014 Scoping Report.

Rather than have both of these documents buried in Appendices of the 2019 Scoping Report, these should have been declared as individual documents in the Navigation documents supplied by EDF as they are the more comprehensive of the two reports.

This approach by EDF is unacceptable and should be brought to all interested parties attention.

An immediate Navigation document update with individual links and PINS reference numbers assigned should be issued, notified to all IPs and all future Navigation documents should have these references maintained.
