Subject: Objection to expanding nuclear power - Sizewell C

Dear Sizewell C Planning Inspectorate

I am writing to strongly object to expanding nuclear power at Sizewell. The grounds of my objections are as follows:-

The position of the plant near to the sea, and in a low lying area known for frequent flooding is a danger to all life should a nuclear accident happen as it did in Fukushima, Chernobyl, Three Mile Island and Kyshtym.

The present proposal will be a blight on the land and a disaster for wildlife, plants and animals, that are contained in the nearby wildlife parks. The increased level of heavy traffic it creates alone will pose dangers to both wildlife and the public. The land used for construction will also be a great loss to the general public, and my family that live in Somerset, that they have enjoyed for many years.

The costs involved of building of two reactors, new roads, increased drains and buildings is staggeringly unrealistic in terms of financing this project with respect to profitable returns because it is simply too slow and too expensive to run. Also the amount of power it will generate for the national grid will be too small and too late to help with reducing our carbon levels. Tax money would be better spent on renewable energy generators, and better, and increased, schemes to insulate existing homes and new homes. Renewable energy has proven to be cheaper to install and more productive than, nuclear, gas, coal or wood fired power stations.

I do hope my objections will be discussed fully and it's not going to be a foregone conclusion that Sizewell C will go ahead.
