

To the Planning Inspectorate

As you can see from my address I live within the area that will be severely affected by the construction of the proposed Sizewell C power station. In particular the proposed building of the Park and Ride at Darsham will have a profound impact on all who use the A12 and the surrounding lanes for their daily business.

Already it can take upwards of 10 minutes to use the junction of the A144 and the A12 at peak holiday times. This brings about an increased use of country lanes, often single track, to avoid it. These lanes are already over used by lorries and delivery vans and are in a poor condition. The lack of verge trimming etc which is in itself a good thing, makes these lanes even more dangerous for walkers, cyclists, riders etc to use. There is no way to avoid wide vehicles. Most children and young people rely on buses and trains to get to schools and colleges and getting to stations and bus stops will be difficult, and the school bus for the Thomas Mills High School uses the layby immediately adjoining the proposed site for the Park and Ride.

This is an area which relies a great deal on the tourist and holiday trade and as such is lucky to maintain a year round trade. The area is internationally famous for it's wildlife which will be directly affected by this construction. Increased traffic, noise and light pollution together with the other environmental damage which will happen, will affect local businesses to a high degree.

The increased offshore Wind Farm industry is becoming hugely

more efficient and able to provide energy for the grid. Already this development is causing environmental damage with the construction of sub stations. However, with sensible planning this could play a much greater part in the generation of electricity for the country without such great destruction of AONBs, SSSIs etc.

The proposed new road south of Yoxford will destroy one of the most attractive areas outside the nature reserves. The destruction of ancient trees and hedgerows will never be recoverable.

New developments in nuclear power generation involving the smaller Rolls Royce units do not appear to be considered. This appears to show lack of imaginative thinking in our needs for electricity generation. Planning of new houses should involve much greater use of up to date micro generation, PV use, insulation qualities and so on.

Coastal erosion is a fact on this coast. This coast is unstable and sea level rise is a fact. How long before a 'once a century' flood scenario happens? These appear to be coming rather more frequent.

In conclusion, the construction of Sizewell C is an impending disaster for this area in many ways. I hope you will consider the long term, and what we should put in place for our future generations. A nuclear power station is not what we need.
