Dear Sir,

I am writing to say that I oppose the planning application to build Sizewell C Nuclear Power Station because of the many drawbacks and disadvantages that are detrimental to the people of Suffolk and the local environment which outweigh any possible benefits.

It will have a disastrous impact on the unique part of the coast which is an area of outstanding natural beauty.

The construction process will be very long and impact negatively the lives of the people living in the immediate vicinity.

The proposals for the demolition and removal of ancillary buildings, roads and support structures and then to return these sites to their original condition are inadequate and unrealistic.

What is going to happen to Sizewell A and B? At present, there are no realistic plans for decommissioning them and they are being left in situ.

The amount of potable water required in the construction process will be huge. This is one of the driest parts of the country. The proposed diesel powered desalination plant lacks capacity and is polluting.

Sizewell A and B are extremely close to an unstable coast at a time when it is known sea levels are rising.

Large nuclear power stations have an enormous carbon cost in their construction and are difficult to decommission. Nuclear energy has proved to be more expensive than any other form of energy generation.

It is a costly and rigid project and there is too much reliance on foreign partners. Britain would be better served if it were able to conceive and adopt a flexible energy policy that is fit for purpose in the 21st century.

It will take too long to build and commission and may well be redundant before it even comes on stream.
