Dear Inspector

Although I have given a few submissions during the planning inspection process I want to make one last plea that you reject the project to build Sizewell C.

Despite the fragmented approach caused by Coronavirus, which effectively diminished the ability of the multitude of voices opposing this initiative to coalesce into a coherent movement, I remain thoroughly opposed to a further nuclear power station in the Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty on the Suffolk coast.

The process itself has been unbelievably divisive locally. EDF's failure to provide at the outset a rational, thought-through plan has meant things have chopped and changed throughout the process and different local groups and areas have had to respond quickly to half-baked proposals without having an opportunity to consider properly all the ramifications themselves.

Even now there is still no clarity as to what happens to the roads being cut by the Sizewell C "relief" road and the impact on communities. Similarly the water situation is a farce and indicative of EDF's poor planning and failure to take this process seriously. You have to wonder what else they have asserted that will turn out untrue - too late for those that live here, of course, should the proposal be approved.

Ultimately, this project should fail because it is just not green and not needed. The risks to the environment of the project, lasting many hundreds of years, alone strip it of any green credentials.

Please realise that this project is unbelievably damaging to the local environment and economy and that it fails to meet the objectives of moving to green, renewable energy. Although standing up to EDF will be a brave and difficult thing to do I encourage you to have the courage and independence of thought not to be railroaded by an arrogant corporation which has shown nothing but contempt towards the local area and, indeed, the planning process itself and has failed to make a compelling case for Sizewell C.
