The Sizewell C Proposal

Of all the multitude of reasons for not granting permission to the applicant to build this third nuclear power station, the most important objection seems to me that we have to **search** for a positive reason to build it at Sizewell. Regardless of the rights and wrongs of nuclear power generation it is patently obvious that this project is in the most inappropriate place it could be.

If the only possible advantage to the location is the dubious value of so-called "local" jobs then the final consideration of whether the benefits outweigh the disadvantages for East Suffolk's inhabitants cannot be met.

I feel that this point is being lost in the minutiae of the arguments, all important in themselves, and that there is a danger that the reasonable voices of the people who will have to endure the consequences will be unheeded.
