Dear Sir/Madam,

I object strongly to this proposal. There are too many unresolved issues for this to go ahead, for example

- lack of a secured long term water supply
- uncertainty about coastal defences
- rising sea levels

Despite EDF's assurances, I am far from convinced that wildlife will not be profoundly affected by the construction. It is never possible to merely 'replace' existing areas of natural beauty, so I am concerned that rare habitats will be lost for ever.

The construction of Sizewell C will devastate the whole area's tourism industry, which is hugely significant for Suffollk.

Heavy traffic will be increased on roads which are already causing worrying levels of pollution.

Very large numbers of workers will be needed, and it is not clear how – or where – they will be accommodated. There is serious concern about the possible consequences of these numbers for local small towns.

Nuclear power is not safe: there is no way of dealing with the resulting hazardous waste. In any case, by the time Sizewell C is built, the technology is likely to be obsolete.

Subsidies to the nuclear industry will cost the tax payer an enormous amount, which should instead be spent on renewables. Public education about conserving power appears to be completely lacking. Given the Government's commitment to tackling climate change, this needs to be remedied.
