I am writing to express my profound disagreement with the plans for Sizewell C.

I will just list some of my points.

- it will not a 'green' or renewable source of energy production - the amount of materials used in construction alone disprove this argument

- there is no feasible way to dispose of the waste materials

- the threat of terrorism at nuclear power stations

- the destruction of a piece of fragile protected coastline

- the enormous cost and financial implications to all UK consumers

- the involvement of China and France, and any other country, and the political ramifications that may follow

- the lack of provision for fresh water in an area of low rainfall

- the loss of many of the footpaths that I regularly walk and the disruption to local villages and small roads. The whole area will be blighted for many many years.

- the nonsense about the build creating 'local jobs for local people'. More local jobs in tourism will be lost. And the local income that comes from the Suffolk coast being an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty.

- the fact that the technology is not proven and similar projects are running up to a decade late and have hit problems

- the timescale for building it will make it far too late to contribute to the urgent need for us all to reduce our carbon footprints if we are to survive catastrophic climate emergencies

- the technology for genuinely renewable technologies is so advanced now that it would be highly effective if the money forecast to be spent on Sizewell C were to be used to fund massive renewable infrastructure projects instead

These are just some of the issues. I appreciate it will be a difficult decision for you to make and no doubt highly divisive but more will be lost than will be gained.
