Effects on the overall impact on the local environment

- a) This coastline is an AONB and there would be tangible negative impacts on local habitats: notably, effects on the Minsmere RSPB site; the consequences of a water desalination plant during construction
- b) Amid new reports of sea level rises coastal defences may be put under threat by this project
- c) Any contribution by the project to Biodiversity Net Gain is under dispute
- d) Tourism and the the local economy would be severely disrupted for the duration of the project
- e) The experience of enjoyment of what this coastline is and has to offer would be irretrievably destroyed for all those who appreciate it

Implications for the wider issue of decarbonising the power system by 2035

Large-scale Nuclear facilities are no longer considered as progressive and indeed this facility may well be obsolete by the time it is completed

It is slow, risky and expensive The latest scientific thinking favours smaller scale nuclear facilities over old fashioned large ones as part of a workable energy source mix
