Subject: Sizewell C

We reside in Wenhaston, an area that would be within the catchment area of Sizewell in terms of any impact it might have on the area (adverse or otherwise). I would be grateful therefore if you would consider the following points when reviewing the ever-changing plans for growth at Sizewell.

- The need to spread risk is accepted but this site will take so long to build that any deal secured will be past its sell by date. A fixed cost deal now will have no bearing on prices in 20 years' time and the investment needed would be better spent on greener alternatives that are UK owned and run.
- This is widely sold as a green alternative, but how green is it really, once the impact of construction and traffic and on-going waste management is accounted for?
- The location is all wrong. Views and impact in and out of AONB are important to residents and the tourist industry as well as the environment, and should be maintained.
- Each plan submitted includes variations that are an ever increasing concern to residents
  and the local council. The continuing growth of buildings in terms of number and height
  are extremely concerning as both will have a negative impact on the countryside.
- EDF have not given a satisfactory explanation as to where the water supply will come from or how it will be transported?
- EDF have not provided adequate reassurances to residents that safety will not be compromised by predicted coastal erosion and or land slippage / movement.
- The overall footprint that will be removed from greenfield sites to enable the project which I understand also includes large scale accommodation for workers, although this will be temporary.
- The impact on Lovers Lane to the recycling depot has not been addressed.

• As members of the RSPB and Minsmere we strongly object to further development of Sizewell, which, cannot fail but to have an adverse impact on this hugely special natural reserve.

For the above reasons we therefore object to the proposal to extend Sizewell.
