Application by Mynydd y Gwynt Ltd for an Order Granting Development Consent for the Mynydd y Gwynt Wind Farm

Request for further information

In Wales the Planning Act 2008² at Section 115 makes limited provision for consent to be given within a Development Consent Order for works which are not ancillary to the project and which would comprise associated development. The application and its supporting documentation describe the various components of the scheme, the works being defined within the draft DCO, but no explanation is provided as to the difference between ancillary and associated development and how the works should be described.

Could parties please provide their views as to whether the various works described in addition to the wind turbine generators should be considered as constituting ancillary development integral to the project?
