Meeting purpose	To discuss the proposed Burbo Bank Extension offshore wind farm scheme
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Summary of key points discussed and advice given	<p>DONG energy gave a presentation on the details and progress of the scheme. The presentation is available attached to this meeting note.</p> <p>The following advice was offered:</p> <p>DONG may wish to begin considering the material they will make available to the relevant Local Authorities for the purposes of their adequacy of consultation representations. The IPC has a discretionary power to request that raw consultation responses be provided to inform the acceptance decision. DONG should therefore ensure that they are available for release in a timely fashion.</p> <p>Non-statutory consultation undertaken in connection with the project should nevertheless be included within the consultation report. This will allow the appointed acceptance Commissioner to get a full picture of the consultation programme. The IPC is currently producing an advice note on the preparation of the consultation report which is due to be published later this year.</p> <p>The IPC has a published advice note on the consideration and assessment of transboundary effects, which DONG may wish to consult in connection with the proposal.</p> <p>The IPC's views on use of the Rochdale Envelope are recorded</p>
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	<p>in advice note nine. In general, it is for developers to determine and justify the level of flexibility they will apply for, having regard to relevant case law and other relevant matters including the National Policy Statement(s) (EN-1 para. 4.2, EN-3 para. 2.6.42 in particular). There is limited scope for amendments to be made the proposal once an application has been submitted, so developers are advised to seek legal advice on drafting their development consent order (DCO) as appropriate.</p> <p>Relevant consents sought in parallel to the DCO application may be relevant to the Examining authority's examination of the proposal.</p>
