**Application for consent to the transfer of all of the benefit of a development consent order  
The North Killingholme (Generating Station) Order 2014 as corrected and amended (the “Order”)**

C.GEN Killingholme Limited (“C.GEN”) writes to seek your consent for the transfer of the benefit of the above Order.

C.GEN is the named undertaker in the Order and Article 6 requires the Secretary of State’s consent to a transfer of the benefit of the Order. In that respect:

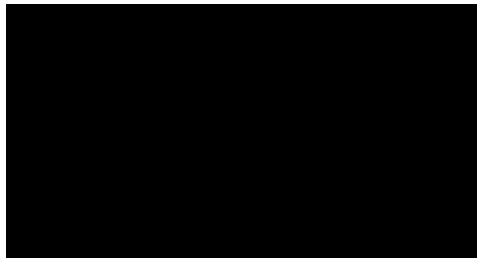
1. C.GEN has concluded binding commercial agreements with Uniper UK Limited (“Uniper”) for the sale of C.GEN’s power generation project, authorised by the Order. The agreements will transfer to Uniper the land and rights that it requires to construct and operate the project and, subject to Secretary of State consent, all of the benefit (and for the avoidance of doubt, obligations, etc.) of the provisions of the Order.
2. The boards of directors of C.GEN and Uniper respectively have authorised the transfer.
3. We have copied Uniper into this request (including by email). Uniper has had sight of this letter and its enclosure and seeks the transfer of all of the benefit of the provisions of the Order to it as named undertaker.
4. We have also sent a copy of this letter to the local planning authority, North Lincolnshire Council.

5. The transfer for which consent is sought is the transfer of the whole of the benefit (and, as above, for the avoidance of doubt all obligations, etc.) of the provisions of the Order.

6. Uniper is a licenced electricity generator. Attached is a copy of Uniper's section 6 licence and a draft deed of assignment of the Order which C.GEN and Uniper propose to enter into if the Secretary of State's consent is given. The section 6 licence dates from 2001 and is in the name of Enfield Energy Centre Limited, Uniper's former name. Also attached is a Companies House change of name certificate dated May 2015 evidencing the new name.

7. We can confirm that the time limits for any claim for compensation in respect of the acquisition of land under the Order have elapsed and there are no claims outstanding. In that respect, the time limit for the exercise of power of compulsory acquisition elapsed and before such powers were exercised.
