The Marine Management Organisation ("MMO") received a request on 19 August 2024, to vary the Deemed Marine Licence (dMLs) contained within Schedule 8 of the Dogger Bank C Wind Farms Orders 2015. The requests were to make the following key changes:

 Currently, the project is conditioned to measure the underwater noise generated by the first four structures with piled foundations at DBC installed under dML 1 (monopiles) and dML 3 (OSP pin-piles). The condition also requires the results of the noise measurements to be provided to the MMO within six weeks of the installation of the first relevant foundation piece under both dML 1 and 3.

The MMO has now completed its consideration of this request in consultation with Natural England, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 72(3)(d) of the Marine and Coastal Access Act 2009, has varied the dMLs as detailed in the Notice of Variation enclosed (Schedules 8).
