Application for Hornsea Offshore Wind Farm Phase 2 DCO

Response to Rule 6 Letter

As you will be aware, E.ON E&P UK Limited ('E.ON E&P') has submitted a relevant representation in relation to the proposed Hornsea Offshore Wind Farm Phase 2 DCO (the 'Scheme').


As E.ON E&P's relevant representation sets out, there is a large overlap between the Scheme and its interests. We therefore support the identification of oil and gas interests contained in the heading 'navigation and marine interests' within the principal issues identified by the Examining Authority at Annex C of the Rule 6 letter.

E.ON E&P will not be attending the Preliminary Meeting, however it will continue to participate in the Examination process, subject to the progress of ongoing discussions with the Applicant.

Those discussions aim to resolve the conflicts between the Scheme and E.ON E&P's interests, however in the event that agreement cannot be reached, E.ON E&P would expect oil and gas issues to be considered at the Issue Specific Hearings scheduled for 17 and/or 18 September 2014.

E.ON E&P notes that it and Conoco Phillips, the other oil and gas business to have submitted a relevant representation, have not been identified within the list of Statements of Common Ground contained at Annex G of the Rule 6 letter. Given the significance of the potential impact of the proposed windfarm on its oil and gas interests, E.ON E&P believes it will be important that the Examining Authority receives updates at key points in the examination process on progress made on reaching agreement on these conflicting interests. E.ON E&P therefore intends to do that, beginning with the deadline for Written Representations.
