On behalf of St Pauls School , Ys-y Coed I would like to emphasise the following areas of concern:

Construction of the power station:

- Noise from the construction itself. What is going to be done to alleviate this? Construction will be on going for some considerable time and it could have a negative impact on the learning of our children.
- Traffic. I understand that construction traffic will not be passing the school. However workers going to the site could use this route. At the beginning and end of the school day, due to the location of the school, we have a major problem with traffic. Parents need to drop off and pick up their children. We are very safety conscious but fear for the safety of our young children. Increased traffic will only serve to increase the dangers.

Power Station

- Noise levels. The power station will emit noise. We are concerned that the background noise will have a negative impact on our children's concentration and their learning. Can you really say that it will have no impact on the children or staff.
- Emissions. There has been insufficient research into the effects of emissions from gas fired power stations on children. We are concerned for the health and wellbeing of our children.

St Paul's is a small (2 classes) school. We have recently federated with another very small school. One of the reasons parents send their children to St Paul's do so because we offer a rural, safe environment for learning. Our concerns are that the power station will alter that. Any fall in our numbers will seriously affect our survival with possible knock on effects for the federation.
