	amended].
	The developer sought re-assurance from PINS on whether it was

appropriate for them to meet the policy team at the Department for Energy and Climate Change (DECC). PINS advised the developer to that they were content for the principles raised in the document to be discussed with DECC and the Department for Communities and Local Government (DCLG) at a policy level and recommended engaging through the Government's proposed Gas Strategy working group.
PINS requested time to review the document in full, given the detail provided and the issues raised. The developer requested that PINS provide a response by 20 March. PINS confirmed that this should be achievable.
