Dear,

East Anglia THREE Limited (**EATL**), a joint venture between Scottish Power Renewables and Vattenfall Wind Power Limited and subsidiary of East Anglia Offshore Wind Limited (**EAOW**), intends to develop and construct a new offshore windfarm within an area of the North Sea off the coast of East Anglia, known as the East Anglia Zone.

The East Anglia Zone is being developed as a number of individual windfarms, each of which will require the appropriate statutory consents and approvals. East Anglia ONE Offshore Windfarm was the first to be proposed within the East Anglia Zone and consent was granted by the Secretary of State on 17th June 2014. You have previously been contacted by us in connection with this application, during consultation under Section 42 of the Planning Act (the Act) earlier this year.

The proposed Project

The East Anglia THREE Offshore Windfarm (the **proposed Project**) forms part of the next stage of development in the East Anglia Zone. The proposed Project would be located 69km from the coast at Lowestoft, covering an area of approximately 305km².

The proposed Project will have an installed capacity of up to 1,200 MW and therefore falls within the definition of a "Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project" (**NSIP**). As a result, EATL is required to submit an application for a development consent order (**DCO**) to the Planning Inspectorate (**PINS**), who will examine the application on behalf of the Secretary of State.

Further consultation on the proposed Project

Since you were contacted earlier this year and provided with a copy of the Preliminary Environmental Information Report (PEIR), a number of changes to the onshore cable route have been proposed as a result of feedback from this phase of consultation and continuing project development. In particular, a number of proposed access points along the onshore cable corridor have been excluded from consideration and more

suitable alternatives proposed. You are being contacted again as land under your ownership is affected by the proposed changes and we wish to provide you with the opportunity to comment.

These changes do not alter the conclusions of the Environmental Impact Assessment as conducted and presented in the PEIR and do not constitute a material change to the proposed Project.

Please find enclosed a set of plans illustrating where changes have been made. We would appreciate your feedback on these proposed changes. Any feedback you provide will be considered prior to finalising the DCO application and will be reported directly to PINS when the application is submitted, alongside any representations you have made previously.

The period for consideration and response to these documents will run from 29th July 2014 to 9th September 2014. **Please ensure that all comments are submitted to EATL before the consultation end date.**
