Ipswich Borough Council (IBC) would like to make the following comments on the need for a Skills Strategy for EA3.

The strategy which was adopted as part of EA1, we believe still to be necessary in order to ensure that local people throughout East Suffolk benefit from the opportunities afforded by the developments of EA1 and EA3. However, we would like the strategy to be reviewed to include IBC and New Anglia Local Enterprise Partnership as key partners in the delivery of skills interventions in relation to the construction, operation and maintenance of EA3 in order to ensure consistency with other construction skills plans and training initiatives that are in place for residents of the Borough and the wider County.

It should also be noted that the "Icanbea" platform is now live and EAOL should ensure that this action from the earlier EA1 Skills Plan is fully implemented.
