**The East Anglia Three Offshore Wind Farm Order 2017 (as amended) -
Application for a Non-material Change 2020**

Historic England is the Government's statutory adviser on all matters relating to the historic environment in England. We are a non-departmental public body established under the National Heritage Act 1983 and sponsored by the Department for Digital Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS). We champion and protect England's historic places, providing expert advice to local planning authorities, developers, owners and communities to help ensure our historic environment is properly understood, enjoyed and cared for.

We have considered the information provided and have the following comments.

We understand that the consultation relates to a proposed amendment to the Development Consent Order (DCO), as amended, for the East Anglia Three Offshore Wind Farm - with changes specifically relating to the Offshore Substations Stations (OSSs) and Wind Turbine Generators (WTGs).

These changes include:

- The reduction in the number of OSS from 6 to 1;
- An increase in the number of pin piles per OSS jacket leg from 1 to 4;
- An increase in the number of legs of the OSS from 4 to 6;
- An increase in the maximum tip height of 247 m to 262 m (relative to Lowest Astronomic Tide (LAT));
- An increase in the minimum air draft of all WTGs from 22 m to 24 m (relative to Mean High Water Springs);
- An increase in maximum rotor diameter from 220 m to 230 m; and
- A reduction in the maximum, total number of WTGs from 172 to 121.

Historic England can confirm we consider the proposed amendments would not result in any new or materially different likely significant impacts, from those described in the original Environmental Statement. We have no further comments in relation to this matter and confirm we are happy to accept the proposed amendments to the DCO.
