Dear Mr Rew-Williamson and Mr Jon Wilson,

**Application by East Anglia THREE Limited (“the Applicant”) for a non-material change to the East Anglia Three Offshore Windfarm Development Consent Order**

1. On 2 August 2022, the Secretary of State wrote to the Applicant noting that the Ministry of Defence (“MoD”), Defence Infrastructure Organisation (“DIO”) had submitted a consultation response in respect of this non-material change application. The Secretary of State requested confirmation from the Applicant that it had no objection to the MODs proposed amendment to replace the postal address on the DCO with the new DIO postal address:

2. On 16 August 2022, the Applicant confirmed that it had no objection to the proposed amendment:

The Secretary of State has subsequently noted that, in the context of planning applications separate to this application regarding the East Anglia Three Offshore Windfarm, the MoD requested, in addition to the change set out at paragraph 1 above, that the location of the remote radar head be amended from Trimmingham to Neatishead. **The Secretary of State therefore requests confirmation from the Applicant and the Defence Infrastructure Organisation that there are no objections to this change**, which in particular would be relevant to articles 33(1) and 33(2)(a) of the East Anglia Three Offshore Windfarm Order 2017.
4. This letter is without prejudice to the Secretary of State’s consideration of the application for a non-material change to the East Anglia Three Offshore Wind Farm Development Consent Order. Nothing in this letter is to be taken to imply what the eventual decision might be or what final conclusions the Secretary of State may reach on any particular issue which is relevant to the determination of the application.
