


The Planning Inspectorate (PINS)

- PINS Project Team:
 - provide advice to communities, applicants, local authorities and others about how to take part in the process;
 - support the Examining Authority (ExA) running the examination.
- ExA:
 - examines the application;
 - makes a recommendation to the Secretary of State.



The Planning Act 2008



Times in **bold** are statutory



The Role of local authorities

- Statutory Consultee (Scoping Opinion and s42 consultation)
- Represent the community
- Providing objective technical evidence
- Discharge requirements (on land)
- Enforcement





Pre-application: The Developer in the lead





Pre-application work for Developers

- Total application: No shocks, no surprises!
- Environmental screening and scoping, PEI and ES
- Consultation with prescribed bodies (s42) and landowners (s44)
- Consultation with the community (SoCC and s47)
- Draft Development Consent Order
- Limited scope for amending applications post submission





Pre-application: Matters to consider

- Adequacy of Consultation (AoC)
- Statements of Common Ground (SoCG)
- Discharge DCO requirements
- Comments on DCO
- Local Impact Reports (LIR)
- Delegations
- EIA / HRA
- Compulsory Acquisition
- Outstanding matters?



Acceptance stage

- 28 days
- Full application
- Main tests:
- Consultation Report has the Applicant fulfilled their duties
- Adequacy of Consultation Any issues raised by LAs
- Full suite of documents
- Ensure all Plans are correct
- If an issue is identified
- PINS publish decision





Pre-Examination stage

- Begins once the application has been accepted
- Relevant Representations (28 days):
 - summary of comments on application documents
 - notify ExA of Principal Issues
 - focus on certain documents (eg DCO / ES mitigation)
 - LAs could helpfully consult Community Councils
- Examining Authority appointed



Pre-Examination cont'd

- Rule 6 letter (comments appreciated):
 - draft examination timetable
 - Initial Assessment of Principal Issues (importance of RR)

Preliminary Meeting:

- purpose: discuss how the case will be examined
- procedural only, merits of scheme not discussed
- LAs/Stat bodies: Could highlight any difficult deadlines to meet
- Venue / local interest in attending?
- Opposition groups?



Examination stage – practical matters

- 6 months tight timescales
 - Quick turnaround of documents
 - Prepare draft documents now/Pre-Exam stage
 - Resource appropriately
- Primarily written process (supplemented by hearings)
- PINS project website
- Types of questions that may arise (see other NSIPs)



Examination cont'd

- Rule 8 letter
 - Timetable / ExA questions / Deadline for LIRs, WRs
- Written Representations (28 days)
 - Expansion of RR
- Respond to ExA questions (and SoCG)
- Submit Local Impact Report (LIR) (AN-1)
 - Factual: Economic / Environmental / Social issues
 - Joint LIR
- Attend site visits



Examination - hearings

- Hearings may be held to supplement written process:
 - Open Floor (OFH)
 - Issue Specific (ISH)
 - Compulsory Acquisition (CAH)
- Style: Inquisitorial, not adversarial
- Attendees
- Order: DCO / ISH; CPA; OFH / DCO
- Be familiar with DCO requirements should Q's arise
- Represent yourselves inquisitorial elaborating on existing material



Recommendation / Decision

- ExA recommendation within 3 months.
- Secretary of State decision within 3 months
- You will be informed of the decision by the Planning Inspectorate

Examination

Provide comment on draft **SOCC** under Section 47

28 days for PINS / SoS to accept

LA encouraged to **prepare Local Impact Report** by a deadline set at Preliminary Meeting

6 months for Examination

Respond to **developer consultation** about the scheme under Section 42

14 days for the LA to submit an **Adequacy of Consultation** representation LA to consider submission of **Relevant Representation** by deadline

Minimum of 28 days for the LA to make a **Written Representation** (extra to the LIR)

Discussion with developer about Section 106 agreements, requirements and obligations

Working with PINS on **outreach** programmes

Begin work / delegations for Local Impact Report / SoCG

Local Impact Report

Attendance at **Hearings** and **Site Visits**

Respond to **ExA questions**
