## Accompanied Site Inspection (ASI) Itinerary – Wednesday 2 May 2018

The Accompanied Site Inspection (ASI) will begin at 10.00am at The Forest Centre, Station Road, Marston Moretaine, Bedfordshire MK43 OPR. So please can attendees meet there.

The ASI will involve the use of a vehicle and will include some walking. The Examining Authority (ExA) request's that all attendees wear appropriate clothing for the weather, and sturdy footwear.

The ExA would like to remind all participants that the site inspection is not an opportunity to make any oral representations on the application, but simply an opportunity to identify physical features that are relevant to the examination.

The Applicant has provided a route for the ASI which the ExA has agreed with. Please note that the itinerary is indicative and therefore it is not possible to predict how long each part of the visit will last or when particular sites will be visited. The itinerary and plan of the route can be found in Annex A of this document.

#### Introduction

- As part of the Examination of the DCO Application for the Millbrook Power Project, an accompanied site inspection (ASI) will be undertaken by the Examiner, the Applicant and other Interested Parties. The ASI is scheduled for the Wednesday 2 May 2018.
- The aim of the ASI is for the Examiner and other Interested Parties to appreciate the setting and surrounding landscape of the Project Site and explore how the Project would be seen from key viewpoints.
- In consultation with Central Bedfordshire Council (CBC) and the Examining Authority, the Applicant has prepared this itinerary for the ASI. The viewpoints selected will provide a comprehensive understanding of the Project in the context of the surrounding area, and consider a range of receptors including residential areas, community facilities, heritage assets and public rights of way.
- The Applicant and CBC have selected locations for the visit that correspond closely with the viewpoint locations selected for the Landscape Visual Impact Assessment (LVIA) of the ES (Chapter 11, Examination Library Reference APP-033). The benefit of such an approach is that existing photomontage material may be utilised as visual aids.

### Itinerary and viewpoints

Table 1 below sets out the itinerary for the ASI and viewpoints which will be visited.

Plan showing the proposed viewpoint locations is provided at Appendix 1.
