Request for Further Information

Your letter of 4 March 2016 raised a concern on behalf of Canal & River Trust (CRT) about the compulsory acquisition provisions of the draft DCO concerning your client's land interests. The written representation dated 23 March 2016 submitted by CRT contained at paragraph 7.2 a formal objection to the inclusion of any of its interests which form part of its waterway network within any compulsory acquisition powers. This objection was restated in the reply you submitted on 6 April 2016 on behalf of CRT to my first written questions 9.4 and 10.2. I have taken these representations to constitute an objection by CRT to the temporary possession of plot 11, and the temporary suspension and acquisition of new rights concerning plots 13, 17 and 23. I assume that CRT has no objection to the temporary suspension of its rights concerning plots 21, 25, 26 and 27.

I appreciate that discussions have been taking place with the applicant, and that these are related in part to the proposed protective provisions concerning CRT to be included in Schedule 13 of the draft DCO. There is, however, no mention of compulsory acquisition concerns in the Statement of Common Ground between the applicant and CRT dated June 2016. I would be grateful therefore for a statement of the final position of CRT by deadline 8 of the examination timetable, 22 August 2016, confirming whether the outstanding objection to temporary possession and compulsory acquisition of rights in these plots where CRT is the freehold owner is maintained or withdrawn.
