Myself and my wife (Ian and Betty Wood) are interested parties in this scheme by way of owning land affected by the proposal.

We would both like to attend the preliminary meeting on 15 March.

I would like to speak at the meeting at an appropriate time. The points I wish to make are to register an objection to the fact that this scheme is being examined at great length, in great detail and at great cost when a visually identical scheme has already been exhaustively considered by Gwynedd Council.

This scheme is required in the public interest to make more efficient use of renewable energy. All interested parties have already been listened to and all issues have been fully considered. This is bureaucracy gone mad at huge cost to the public purse. The Planning Inspectorate should consider ways to shorten the process and 'fast-track' to an early conclusion.

As a first step to economising on the costs of this hearing, Ian Wood, Betty Wood and Gavin Wood (as joint owners of the land in question) will from now on accept just one copy of relevant papers, rather than three sets we have received up to now.
