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We are concerned that Scottish Power Renewables are trying to avoid doing a cumulative impact assessment of additional projects that are widely understood to be connecting to the grid at Friston if consent is granted for EA1 North and EA2.

We respectfully ask the examining authorities to insist that all additional projects are taken into account including where landfall would be made, the route the cable corridor would take and the damage caused by additional substations being build on greenfield sites.

There is plenty of information in the public domain to show that plans are afoot to use the Friston site for additional onshore infrastructure, National Grid Ventures latest response with reference to Nautilus and Eurolink Multi-purpose interconnector projects states "initial routing and siting work has been based on the reasonable assumption of a protential connection location at the proposed Friston substation". Galloper Extention Offshore wind farm developers state that "we currently have an offer from National Grid to connect in to Friston.

It seems to me that National Grid are planning multiple connections at the Friston site and that these plans are being hidden under the cloak of the SPR application, this cannot be right, the full impact of what is being prosposed for the area covering Thorpness, Aldeburgh, Aldringham, Knodishall and Friston needs to be examinded. You will be aware of the devastating impact these projects will have on the area.
