It appears that SPR do not considerate it appropriate to consider all the other projects in the pipeline which could be terminated in Friston if (god forbid) the current SPR proposals were to be approved. The cumulative effect of all these pipeline proposals is devastating on an attractive community with a very large tourist economic input which would be mainly destroyed.

The inspectorate must request SPR to perform a full cumulative assessment and examine in detail the consequences.

There are several "brown field sites" that have not been considered on the East Anglian Coast which would be far more suitable for a very major long term development. I believe the National Grid are still refusing to attend any sessions. They are surely "not suitable for purpose" and should be replaced by a more democratic organization.
