My husband and I have been living peacefully and happily in Friston for over 15 years. Along with many of our friends we are horrified by the way Scottish Power is planning to destroy our beautiful and historical countryside. We are at a loss to understand why Friston was the chosen site for such a development, being far from the coast and with few major roads or railway connection. Certainly it is not a Brownfield Site.

At present confusing road signs appear, noisy machinery is at work digging up the fields and our peace is shattered. I was gardening recently and the only sound I could hear was the chug of a machine interspersed with a "beep,beep" which went on for a good 30 minutes, till I could bear it no longer and had to retreat indoors. Hardly the peaceful countryside. Friston is a holiday village with many cottages available for rental, but we fear the holidaymakers will not continue to come, thus ruining our local tourist economy. We also question how our narrow country roads will cope with the increased amount of construction traffic.
