2	I understand that the BEIS is in fact currently looking for a holistic and less damaging solution to the question of how to connect offshore energy to the National Grid.	The Applicants have provided submission previously on why it would not be appropriate or feasible for the Projects to be awarded consent on the basis of a split decision. Ultimately in the event of a split decision, the Projects could not bid into a Contracts for Difference (CfD) Auction and the engagement of supply chain would stop. Without confidence about delivery, suppliers would cease to engage. There are no alternative technology solutions which are likely to come forward within the lifetime of the consents.
