Dear Planning Inspectorate.

I take issue with SPR's answer to your question ExQs3. 3.8.4.

The track between Friston and Little Moor farm has existed for 500 plus years. The track linked Friston to the homestead of eight occupied properties at Little Moor Farm which was known as Hunts Farm Settlement, and the moated parsonage.

This track is there because of the homestead so therefore is of massive significance to the existing properties heritage and the foundations of the other properties, which are still visible in the ground. My deeds still show easements for access to Little Moor along the track from Friston.

SPR's dismissal of its importance shows their complete disregard for our country's history. They are only interested in bulldozing their project through and their only driver is cost. They are not a sustainable green developer as they claim; in fact, this is turning into "Very Dirty Wind". They are a profit-making conglomerate with zero conscience.

I endorse the views of organisations who really understand the uniqueness of these assets, Historic England, SASES and the councils as well as numerous IP's.

I thank the Inspectorate for their due diligence during these trying times and implore you not to allow the destruction of the irreplaceable when there are so many viable alternatives.
