Dear Mr Smith,

Further to the examination and the issues of flooding in Friston, I feel that it is imperative that you see yet another example of very recent flooding that occurred in Friston on the 18th June 2021. Included is footage of damage done to the highway at that time.

An issue that I feel has been avoided is that surrounding the issue of uplift from the trenches. From conversations with villagers in the area affected by the Anglia One project the lorries that blocked their lanes for months and months transporting the large amount of soil was intolerable. I would like to see more evidence that the Applicant has a serious plan for dealing with this uplift?

I would like to remind you that should you recommend that the planned substations are built in Friston, described by Scottish Power's representative, as an already existing "urban development" then you will be leaving the door open for a plethora of other energy projects to be constructed in Friston.
