Having listened to and read most of the evidence presented by all sides I believe that the SPR proposal is totally inappropriate for this part of Suffolk and would result in destruction of all we hold dear in these rural and semi-rural communities damaging the natural environment, our health, economy and quality of life. All the other proposed (and not yet proposed) cumulative effects would further damage the communities for ever.

I consider the only viable solution is a "Split Decision" where permission is granted for the sea based wind-farms to proceed and progress but the on-shore proposals should be refused and other options should be investigated including brown field and industrial sites. (Nearer the bulk of consumers?)

If the off-shore connection is properly coordinated to receive other connections (the technology for this exists) then the on-shore terminals can be sited in any number of appropriate areas as the connections would not need to come ashore in this coastal area at all.
