These remarks apply to East Anglia One North and East Anglia Two.

Dear Panel,

At this time of year, the fields and tracks around Ness House Cottages and Wardens are busy with the passage of deer, whose regular beat, on emerging from nearby woodland, takes in Plots 13, 12, 11, 4 and all adjacent areas.

Neighbours along the Cable Corridor route from Landfall are experiencing the same presence.

This wandering route is bounded by the sea on one side and roads on the other. It's a natural wildlife corridor, an important pinch-point, which is to be taken over by the infrastructure associated with SPR's Landfall and Cable Corridor

I fear for the effect on the herd of mixed species of deer whose territory this is.

Ideally I'd have liked to create a map to superimpose upon the cable corridor map, with photographs taken by residents at locations along the Cable Corridor showing evidence of deer. They are abundant all across the Landfall and adjacent cable corridor route.

SPR describe the continuous fencing with which they will contain the cable corridor route to the west. The haul road and its associated machinery will also occupy the area .

In terms of the disastrous effects upon this long- established flock, the site selection process is utterly flawed. Death and fragmentation of social and family groups is bound to occur.

I attach photographs showing deer tracks at Plot 13, the borehole on Plot 4, Plot 11, and a video showing deer passing Ness House Cottages and moving back into Plot 13, following their usual route.

This is a clear indication of the unsuitability of this narrow belt of land for development and industrialisation on the basis of desktop studies on the part of The Applicants.
