Dear Planning Inspectors

Further to the letter from the Secretary of State, The Rt Hon Kwasi Kwarteng dated 2nd November, I write to voice my concerns about rising sea levels and the risk of flooding along the East Suffolk coast.

We have recently had a high tide which clearly demonstrated the vulnerability of this coastline. The attached photos were taken on 7th November on a calm day with a light offshore wind. The first photo shows how high the tide reached at Sizewell, almost clearing the shingle beach. The second shows the tide level reached on the river at Aldeburgh.

I am sure you will appreciate that with rising sea levels and onshore winds, it would not take much for the beach or sea defences to be breached and therefore put the whole coastline and the cliffs at Thorpeness, where the cables for East Anglia One and Two are to come ashore, at risk. The recent cliff falls at Thorpeness are evidence that the claims of a crumbling coastline are not exaggerated.

I once again urge you to reject the planning applications for East Anglia One North and Two.
