Please find attached a painting I made in response to the threat of this substation being built in the middle of our beautiful unspoilt land here on the Suffolk coast.

We need renewable, clean energy but NOT at a devastating cost to the environment, wildlife and local communities WHEN THERE ARE ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS.

I haven't spoken to a single person who thinks this site is a suitable place for such a construction. In fact every single person I have spoken to over the past few months about these plans have been absolutely horrified at the idea.

I haven't heard or been able to find a single argument as to why this location has been chosen.

The onshore infrastructure should be rejected in favour of full consideration of better locations for this infrastructure where the adverse impacts are minimised at a brownfield/ industrialised site.

We MUST start protecting our land where we have a choice to do so and begin to develop new ways of measuring value.
