Dear Secretary of State,

East Anglia will play a significant part in achieving the UK's 40GW in power goals by 2030. I endorse these important goals.

However there will be severe adverse impact from these projects on our on —shore environment affecting the most fragile eco system of wet lands, woodland, coastal nature as well as a thriving tourist industry dependant on the beauty, nature and tranquillity of the coastal area. The lives of thousands of people who live in the area will be changed for ever by mass industrialisation of green belt land not to mention the massive weight of construction vehicles using our narrow country roads for many years to come. The other impact that never seems to be discussed is the massive work force (5,000 +) that will have to be imported to the area, temporary homes constructed, again on greenfield sites, and local infrastructure not in any way able to cope. For the long term there will be very few jobs created to run these complexes so they are not only destroying the local environment but only bringing devastation to a unique area of the British Isles.

Yes to Wind Energy but NO to destroying green belt land when the onshore infrastructure must be directed to brownfield sites or already industrialised areas.
