- Socio Economic Effects

These are not sufficiently addressed in the Applicant's DCO and I wish to ensure that during the examination process due regard is given to :

- The unique characteristics of this area of the Heritage Coast;
- Peace and tranquillity, landscapes, seascapes and habitats etc which are an irreplaceable amenity and need managing and preserving as such for the country;
- These are preserved and sustained by the local population, who whilst may be primarily retired and ageing provide invaluable manpower and diverse expertise voluntarily eg: coastal erosion; facilities for the young and disabled; institutions and organisations
- eg: coastal erosion; facilities for the young and disabled; institutions and organisations dedicated to the environment, heritage etc
- In turn that requires a continued influx of similar committed citizens to replace those who die or are forced to move away.
- The extended development periods of the cumulative energy projects extend to at least 12 years and that workforce, management, support staff requires accommodation putting strain on its availability for all and how to sustain the local qualitative needs.
- Against a background where Local Plans propose a major expansion of housing in Suffolk whose residents will wish to enjoy the characteristis of the area.

- Open Floor Hearing and to possibly speak if certain issues, primarily socio-economic, are not sufficiently addressed.
