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Dear Sirs,

You will have heard the very considerable concern that has been expressed by residents local to the Scottish Power Renewables proposed development in Friston about the cumulative impacts of further as yet unconsented developments on or adjacent to the proposed Scottish Power site. In particular, the role of National Grid Electricity Transmission (NGET) in future developments.

I note with dismay that in its response to you of 2<sup>nd</sup> November, NGET has indicated that it is not their intention to attend Issue Specific Hearings (ISH1 or ISH2) or the Compulsory Acquisition hearing (CAH1) at this stage. They go on to say that they “reserve their position to attend future hearings [and] will notify the ExA, should they feel it necessary to appear”.

Given the level of anxiety in the community about NGET’s exact intentions, this response to you seems cavalier in the extreme and misses an opportunity for NGET to explain their position and allay fears if they are able to. I would urge Planning Inspectorate to do all in its power to persuade NGET to attend the hearings and disclose their future plans in relation to the Friston site.
