I would further like to add to representations already heard regarding issues discussed at the hearings:

I am a resident of Friston.

The issue of flooding in Friston has been discussed and evidence in video format is available. However, what is deeply worrying is that none of us can predict the rate climate change will impact on our environment. Suffolk has in the past been recognised as one of the drier areas of the UK. Even with these conditions Friston has flooded badly.

Climate change is forcing us to rethink the way we all live and indeed where we can live. The construction of hard standing on this scale would exacerbate the flooding problem to those who live in the village. The real issue is though, that we do not know what the rainfall will be in 5, 10, or 20 years in this area, or the amount which will be falling in a given timescale. I cannot see how, it is in anyway prudent to create a problem now, which in a few years to come will become a disaster. We surely do not deserve to have to live under this threat, when there are other options available.

Having listened to evidence given by SPR on the construction of the landfall areas, I am seriously worried that they have failed to plan this project. The answers to some of the questions showed a lack of knowledge to a subject they are supposedly experts of. My confidence in their abilities is very low.
