"Dear Sirs

I understand that an analysis has been done of the likely economic impact on tourism of the scheme going ahead and came up with a figure of minus 20%

If that is applied to visiting golfers, the likely impact for the golf club would be in excess of £35,000 per annum based on a loss of 20% of visitor income

In addition, we advised the hearing in November that a survey of golfing visitors to another area suggested that their secondary spend is on average about £50 per head - based on 3,000 visitors, 20% of £150,000 equals £30,000

This makes the total loss in respect of visiting golfers in excess of £65,000 per annum to the local economy

In addition, the Club might well lose a significant amount of subscription income as 50% of its members live outside Suffolk and might stop visiting Aldeburgh and resign from the Club if the scheme (in particular the lorry traffic) makes it an unattractive place to visit.
