Dear Examining Authority,

In response to Action Point 2, The Planning Balance from Open Floor Hearing 6, I ask that the Examining Authorities recommend a SPLIT DECISION to the Secretary of State. This being -

- The offshore turbines are recommended for consent. We all support renewable energy.
- The onshore infrastructure proposal is rejected. The devastating effect that the current proposal would have on our beautiful landscapes, our wildlife, our communities, our tourism and above all on the quality of life and mental health of all who live in the area, would be catastrophic. This can all be protected if a far more suitable brownfield site is used for the infrastructure.

This split decision would allow progress in offshore construction, while also crucially allowing time to plan much less needlessly destructive onshore infrastructure. We all want to support the development of green energy but in this case the devastatingly destructive onshore proposals make this impossible.
